*** HOLIDAY SAFETY ***

The Holidays are always a time for families and friends to get together!
This time of the year is also a greater risk for fires. We have some great holiday tips for our residents to follow while decorating and cooking!



HOLIDAY DECORATING

- *Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that burn.
- *Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections.
- *Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- *Choose decorations that are flame resistant and flame retardant.



COOKING SAFETY

- * Keep anything that can catch fire away from stove top (oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains)
- *Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, grilling, or broiling food. If you have to leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove. Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.



CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY

- *Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that don't fall off when touched. Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2 inches from the base of the trunk.
- *Make sure the tree is at least 3 feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators,candles,heat vents, or lights.
- *Add water to the tree stand daily!
- *Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- *Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.
- *Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections.
